Normally, a research stay lasts from between two weeks to three months; longer stays are possible in special cases.

Organizational Details

Guest researchers must have a Master of Law (or a Master's degree in a similar field), have some research experience in the field of social law, and be interested in the cultural and interdisciplinary exchange of knowledge and ideas.

Our guests will have a work space with Internet connection, access to the university library facilities, special faculty rates in our university food and drink outlets, a CampusCard, as well as support in organizing the details of their stay, e.g. in finding suitable housing.

Financial Details

Our guest researchers mainly deal with all financial matters themselves. It may be possible for a guest researcher to apply for funding from the Swiss National Science Foundation under a scheme entitled "International Short Visits".
